1. Call to Order: 9:03

- A. Roll Call to Establish Quorum

3. Old Business

Discussion/Action Item:

A. Semester End Party

Chairperson Armando informed representatives that the event would be held on the last ICC meeting, Friday, December 2nd. The event will be exclusive to ICC representatives only, invitations to all clubs will be sent out. Budget will be a maximum of \$15 per person attending.
