1. Call to Order: 9:08

5. New Business

Discussion/Action:

A. ICC Meeting Times

- Chairman Armando asks for feedback on potentially changing the ICC meeting time. Relays that if enough representatives respond, a different meeting date may be considered.

- Chairman Armando relays that since the compressed calendar began last semester and the Winter Intersession began, it became increasingly difficult to include an ICC meeting during the week.
- Advisor Marilyn relays that before the current schedule, ICC meetings were held on Wednesdays, at 12:30 PM.
- GeoScience's preferred times are Fridays at 10 AM or Tuesdays at 12:30 PM.
- Advisor Armando notes that 10 AM on Fridays would not be a possible meeting time since the ASG meets on Fridays from 10:15 AM to 12:15 PM.
- LDSSA relays that the club has agreed upon Tuesdays at 12:30 PM as well.
- Californians for California's also concurs that Tuesdays at 12:30 PM would work.
- M.E.Ch.A relays that later hours on Fridays would work best.
- Circle K suggests 11 AM to 12 PM as another option.
- Chairman Armando relays that if the meeting is moved to a later time of day on Fridays, it would have to be at 1 PM or later because of the ASG meetings.
- Chairman also notes that there is strong feedback for Tuesdays at 12:30, but Fridays at 1 PM or later will also be considered.

6. Point Allocations

A. Fall 2016 Point Totals

- Chairman Armando provides background on the point allocation system: The ICC allocates points to clubs that gets tallied at the end of the academic year. The top 10 clubs receive cash prizes that they can use towards their clubs.
- Advisor Marilyn explains that at the end of the academic year, the points equate to dollars. The point totals are calculated by the last meeting of the semester. Two to three weeks after, the money is dropped into the club accounts. Clubs would just then submit the proper paperwork to utilize their club accounts.
- The top 10 clubs for Fall 2016 are as follows: No Limits (95 points), Circle K (80 points), Active Minds (75 points), Palomar Tech Club (65 points), Chem Club (60 points), Woodworkers for Palomar (55 points), NASA (45 points), Dance Club (40 points), MSU (25 points), GeoScience Club (19 points).
- Chairman Armando congratulates the top clubs, and reminds all representatives that the club fund is also available.
- Advisor Marilyn relays that 4 out of the 10 clubs have not yet reinstated. The list may still change.
- Chairman Armando notes that the current points are low in comparison to other clubs. Points have reached 400 for a single club. Clubs can still increase their points with participation in events and meetings (5 points/meeting).
- Advisor Marilyn reminds clubs that if they approve points for participation Diversity Day and Spring Fest by ASG, and Spring event by ICC, they may start increasing their totals.
