**5. New Business**

Discussion/Action:

- A. Earth Day

- The ICC event is an opportunity for students to promote the club while upholding the concept of Reduce, Reuse, Recycle.
  - Advisor Lunde notes that seeds and plants have been used as promotional items before. The event could be a big event for the clubs if they choose to make it one.
  - The event will take place in the SU Quad, April 20 at 10 AM.
  - Chairperson Armando encourages clubs to begin preparations for the event. Item will be discussed further in the following meetings.
- B. ASG Election Day
- Chairperson Armando relays that ASG Election will be from April 17<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> with all paperwork to be submitted by April 6<sup>th</sup>.

### B. Chairperson's Report (Chairman Armando Contreras)

- Chairperson relays that he will be travelling to Washington D.C. next week with the ASG for a conference. Is hoping to visit the White House while on the trip.
- Reminds representatives that any feedback or questions can be shared after the meeting or emailed in the email provided on the agenda.
- Informs representatives that the Vice-Chairperson is currently vacant. Is looking for a temporary Vice-Chairperson to lead the next meeting. Due to the D.C. trip, Chairperson Armando will not be able to attend next week's meeting.

C. Advisor's Report (Marilyn Lunde)

- Advisor relays that every year, there are two special scholarships awarded to students on the day of commencement.
- Encourages representatives to apply and follow the instructions in the application very carefully. Application packets are available in the OSA.
- The S.E.A.L Center is hosting a film series on Mondays at 4:30 PM with free pizza, drinks, and popcorn. This Monday's film is *The Hurt Locker*.
- Informs clubs that there is a new director for the cafeteria. There are now catering sheets available to the clubs, offering cheaper prices for some food products. Representatives must go through the OSA when ordering.
- There will be a meeting next week. Chairperson will not be present.
- Notes to representatives that Vice-Chairperson position is very important as the VC may have to lead the meetings from time to time.

8. **Weekly Discussion Item: Feedback on Club Rush.**

- Chairperson leads item. Focus is to collect feedback on recent Club Rush event.
- Palomar Tech Club suggests having an event coordinator for events. Also suggests additional decorations, increased club participation, and better organization.
- Palomar Tech Club also suggests having a stipulation allowing clubs yet to be reinstated to participate in the event.
- M.E.Ch.A. suggests increasing the range of activities clubs can do.
- Chairperson relays that most of the restrictions placed on the clubs are due to Palomar's regulations as well. Restrictions on food, for one, were due to an instance that once led to a student getting sick.
- Advisor informs the representatives about the California Ed Code's Kitchen Act which prohibits an institution to give out food outside of its official suppliers.
- Circle K notes that if Palomar had a culinary department, then there may be a way to serve food and be compliant to Kitchen Act. But since there is none, clubs would have to comply with the food regulations.
- Chem Club inquires if a demonstration on chemical processes involving food would be Kitchen Act compliant. Advisors relays that as long as the food is not served, a demonstration would be allowable.
