- a. Chairperson: Discord, group app, is almost ready to go. Setup to make it a secure place to have conversation is still in the work
- b. Astronomy club: Asking what discord is
- c. Chairperson: it's a communication app for an ICC group chat
- d. Young Americans for Liberty: suggests doing an authentication to make the app more secure
- e. Tech club: asking about who will be able to access Discord

5. New Business:

- a. 2019 Bike MS Bay looking for volunteers. They bring together cyclist to raise funds and awareness for those who face challenges of MS everyday. 7. Reports:

- a. Geoscience Connection Club: our last meeting was on Tuesday, it's the first Tuesday of every month. We will be going to the Gemological Institute of America, the 25th of October at 11-12:30. We will be getting a private tour with our group of the campus and they're gonna focus more on scientific things and the mining and we get to look at mineral specimens. We might even have Dr Shigley do our tour for us. We're planning our poster and other events and getting out t shirts made.
- b. Young Americans for Liberty: Last meeting on wednesday, we had a very productive discussion. We had a new member come on board and we were graced by the presence of our State Chair and got to discuss our future plans with some of the programs and also got in touch with our deputy regional director and went over plans of our club in the coming semester
- c. Palomar College Democrats: club just got reinstated and in the process of starting up the meetings and figuring out things and recruiting officers
- d. Ceramics Arts and Silicated Association: we met last wednesday with our advisor. We're trying to figure out the appropriate amounts of time to meet, I'm thinking once every 2 weeks or so would be great. Other than that, no updates
- e. Palomar Astronomy Club: We just had our club elections and for the first time in over a year, we have all 4 officer positions filled. Our next meeting is Tuesday October 15th at 4pm in NS-117. Our first meeting will be after elections and we will be talking about black holes and other spooky stuff in space
- f. Pre-Law Club/One Hell of a Club: Currently, this week we went through and made our first fliers and sent out emails to members and are working on getting our first meeting set up. We are having a planning meeting to try to elect officers and discuss theories of murder, difference between 1st and 2nd degree murders and maybe pathways to la. We've had advisor meetings and mainly working on setting up regular meetings for the future

- g. Umjoa: we just had our 3rd or 4th meeting on the 1st of October. We are going to be meeting every Tuesday, once a month face to face, and the rest on video chat because most of our members have class during that time
- h. Palomar Film Club: we had our meeting last monday at 2:30 in Q-2. Right now we just discussed a promotional commercial that we're going to start working on to promote the club, so we're working on shooting that in the next week or so. Second one was the X&Y screening on Wednesday, That was with Puente, math club and MATCH. We have an upcoming screening of *You were Never Really Here* on Oct 24th at 3:30 in P-32
- i. Transitions Collective: this past wednesday, we collaborated with Puente to show *Real Women have Curves*. It was almost a full house in MD-157. Meet and Greet and tacos at the beginning. Panel participation. This coming Wednesday, we're showing the *13th* in reference to the 13th amendment. MD-157 at 5:30. It's free, there will be snacks and goodies and a panel discussing the 13th amendment and how it affects marginalized people. We just got our first order of t-shirts and wristbands, they will be available for public consumption. Donations are graciously accepted for t-shirts, they're' going to be 20, and wristbands are a dollar a piece. Come one come all, our next meeting is Thursday coming up, 11am in SU-204
- j. Chemistry Club: we had our last meeting September 26th, we have our meetings every other thursday in NS-358. Last Thursday, we had professor Mark Raymundo talk about some of his previous research about molecular dynamics. He also discussed some possible upcoming undergrad research here at palomar. Our next meeting is going to be October 10th, we're going to be talking about community outreach events with San Marcos Middle School and a few other schools in the area, that go out and do science activities with some of the students there. Also this week, we had 6 members join the American Chemistry Society, that kind of legitimized our club with a national body. We always have free pizza at our meetings so come on out.
- k. P&E club: we have received materials to start building electromagnets to start building a train. We're also taking orders for t-shirt and we're discussing plans for how to get more people and how to get more events going
- l. Intervarsity Christian Fellowship club: last week we had a new bible study start with a new leader, so now we have 4 bible studies currently on campus on 4 different days. And we've just been going through the reigns. We had another large group last week where we had a turnout of 40 people at CSUSM. WE had 2 people re-devote their lives to God
- m. LDSSA: event wise, we had plans for a Halloween activity on the 14th of October, but we moved it to the 21st instead. That is still in the works, we're still trying to get all the details down, there will be pumpkin carvings and stuff going out there. We're usually on campus on wednesdays. We still are having lunches at our institute building on Tuesdays and Wednesday from 11-1. And also we're starting to get some regular meetings going as well with our members on thursdays 9:30-10, those will be starting next week

- n. Cyber Security club: we meet every 1st and 3rd Wednesday of the month at 4pm in MD-220. We've been training for NCL, a national cyber league. We're looking for people interested in joining the team. Currently, the events are from October 14-21st for preseason game, November 1-3 for individual game, November 15-17 for team game. If you want to practice ahead of time, there's PICOCTF, aimed more at middle and highschool students but it's really good practice for NCL
- o. Tech Club: I recently attended an event at CSUSM. If anyone is interested, I suggest checking it out if interested in electronics, programming, physics, etc. You don't have to be a member of CSUSM and you may not have to pay any fees or just attend as a person. Can ask me for a discord invite and show up to their meetings or any information on that. We're working on an event in November on making a robot, and we have to finalize the date and all formalities, so may or may not expect an event. We're also looking to grow our membership, if anyone is interested in joining please come. Were also training for NCL
- p. Psychology Psi Beta: we have our next meeting today in MD-216 from 11-1. We have 4 of our professors here giving a mini-panel. Additionally, for Halloween, we have a pumpkin decorating contest and some games
- q. Photo Club: one of our advisors gave a workshop in the photo lab on gelatin fiber printing. Yesterday the club had a meeting but we met at the Arboretum, the president of the arboretum gave us a tour and we did a scavenger hunt where we looked for specific things and took photos and stuff like that. My purpose was to show students the arboretum which most didn't know were there and to just get us out taking pictures and it was successful on both counts.
- r. Rhetoric Symposium: this past tuesday we discussed the language and benefits of violence and the circumstances at which it is acceptable. We also discussed new strategies for recruiting and are considering collaborating with other clubs and see if we may cross recruit or consider announcing at each other's clubs
- s. Chairperson: nothing else to report
- t. Vice Chairperson: if you are here past roll call, take a seat, if you're a club member announce yourself or let the secretary or chairperson know what club you're in after roll call. It helps keeps track of points so you get credit for the day. I'm keeping track of points and meeting points and sending out reports if you're under suspension, if you want to know if you're at risk or how many meetings until you're not under suspension, just ask me. The points have to wait to be finalized.
- u. Advisor: email club meetings (start time, end time, date, graphics). As a recognized student organization you can reserve a table and get a spot in the quad to recruit members. Film club is the first to be branching out to Rancho Bernardo now. Highly encourage club to expand, just make sure you have another advisor at that campus.
