Courses that articulate as MATH 5, 9A, or 22 will meet this requirement. ••NEW: The College of Natural and Agricultural Sciences will now be accepting IGETC, however students should focus on completing lower division major preparation.
SAN DIEGO	NO	UC San Diego faculty approved 2017-18 lower division major prep changes. UCSD will honor these changes for 2018 applicants. We do not expect students to be disadvantaged for admission purposes.
