

HOW TO MAKE SINGULAR NOUNS AND PLURAL NOUNS POSSESSIVE IN ENGLISH

SINGULAR NOUNS: MAKE THEM POSSESSIVE

Examples: a) My friend has a car.	<u>SINGULAR</u>	<u>POSSESSIVE</u>
My friend's car is red.	FRIEND	FRIEND'S
b) The student has a book.		
The student's book is blue.	STUDENT	STUDENT'S

RULE: To show that a person possesses (owns) something, add an apostrophe (') and s to a singular noun.

HOW TO MAKE A PLURAL NOUN POSSESSIVE:

Examples: a) The students have books.	<u>PLURAL</u>	<u>POSSESSIVE</u>
The students' books are blue.	STUDENTS	STUDENTS'
b) My friends have a car.		
My friends' car is red.	FRIENDS	FRIENDS'
