

FYE – Promise Success Agreement

The First-Year Experience Program (FYE) is a year-long college program focused on providing first-year students with the resources and support needed to transition successfully to college.

As a FYE student, you will benefit from the following services:

- Academic and career counseling, including priority access to a FYE counselor.
- Individualized educational plan to ensure that you complete the necessary courses in order to meet your goal in a timely manner.
- Registration and financial aid application assistance.
- Academic enrichment, career and social activities throughout the year.
- Opportunity to meet new people and form lasting friendships.

To remain part of the FYE program, I commit to the following:

- Meet with a counselor to develop an abbreviated Student Educational Plan (SEP) by the end of my first semester and a comprehensive SEP by the end of my second semester. I agree to follow my SEP. *This can be completed at the TLC, General Counseling, EOP&S, DRC, TRIO, STEM and Veterans Services.*
- Attend 1-2 Skillshops and/or approved campus activities per semester.
- Make my education a priority by regularly attending all my classes and successfully complete the entire academic school year (Fall and Spring) by setting realistic educational goals.
- Notify the FYE program of any change in my status at Palomar College, such as dropping a class, academic probation, withdrawal, leave of absence, transfer to another school, etc.
- Provide 24-hour notice if I need to cancel or reschedule a counseling appointment.
- Update any changes in my contact information (email, phone, and mailing address) in eServices.
- Check my Palomar College email regularly for updates, information, and communication.
- Understand that the FYE program will monitor my progress by contacting my instructors while I participate in the FYE program. I understand I may be referred to the appropriate academic and student support services based on input from my instructors.
- Authorize the FYE program to obtain and/or exchange any records or data from the Admissions and Records Office, Financial Aid Office, any student academic support program (TRIO, DRC, EOP&S), and from my high school district.
- Abide by the Palomar College Student Code of Conduct.

Academic Standards

I understand that to be eligible to participate in Palomar Promise I must be a first-time college student, California resident and have filed a FAFSA or California Dream Act application.

In order to remain in good standing with Palomar Promise, I take responsibility for:

- Completing the program requirements outlined in the FYE-Promise Success Agreement
- Maintaining full-time enrollment (12 or more units) per semester, based on my Student Educational Plan (SEP). I will consult with a counselor before making any changes to my educational plan, to ensure my continued academic success
- Maintaining a minimum 2.0 GPA while attending Palomar. If necessary, I agree to participate in academic intervention activities to regain my good standing

I understand if I do not meet the above requirements, my FYE- Promise status may be affected or I may be dismissed from the program.
