

Final Exam Preparation

1. The exam is cumulative, covering every chapter listed on the class schedule, with the exception of sections 4.7, 5.7, 5.9, 6.5, 7.4.
2. Any kind of problem that was fair game on previous tests is also fair game on the final.
3. A large portion of the final exam will be based on previous tests. This means that many (but not all) problems on the exam will be similar to problems you have been tested on before.
4. Over half the questions on the final are multiple choice.
5. You should memorize any formulas, theorems, and definitions that you were required to know for previous tests.
- 6. Study Suggestions:**
 - a) At the very least, make sure you can do all the problems that appear on previous tests and the homework from chapter 9.
 - b) If you need an A or B on the final, then (along with studying previous tests) I suggest you use your homework and class notes as a study guide to prepare for this exam. Go through your notes and homework section-by-section in order to make sure you know how to do each type of problem that you encountered this semester.
