Module 5 Assignment: ASL 206L

- Review and memorize vocabulary in <u>Learning American Sign</u> <u>Language (LASL)</u> Units 1-24 and <u>Signing Naturally, Level 2</u> Unit 14. Drill yourself on vocabulary until you can produce each sign or phrase in either book and recognition of each sign is automatic. Go over your class notes. If your teacher has taught you any new signs that are not in these units or if you are farther along in your class, take time to remember and practice all vocabulary before you go on.
- 2. View the videotape and complete the workbook exercises in Unit 16 of <u>Signing Naturally, Level 2</u>. We skipped Unit 13 and are skipping Unit 15 for now. Remember to read the workbook instructions carefully and record your answers on a separate piece of paper. Check your answers in the back of the book. If you give more than two incorrect answers in any given section, watch the videotape again to figure out why you got it wrong, then turn your paper over and do the exercise again.
- 3. If you still have more than a couple of incorrect answers in each section, go back and review the videotape. Can you see now what went wrong? If you are having substantial difficulty with any of the sections even after you checked the answers in the back of the book, write a short paragraph to explain what you are struggling with and email it to me with this week's assignments.
- 4. Take good notes on the Culture/Language Notes in <u>SN</u> and keep the notes in your notebook to refer back to.
- 5. Respond in writing to the following questions and email it to me with this week's assignments:
 - What do you still find most confusing in <u>LASL</u>?
 - How well do you know the vocabulary in <u>LASL</u>?
 Ory well, okay, or not very well
 - What book and unit is your teacher covering right now in your ASL 4 class?
 - What do you find most confusing <u>SN</u> Units 14 and 16?
 - How well do you know the vocabulary in <u>SN</u>?
 - Very well, okay, or not very well

In what ways was it most helpful? What about the video was least helpful?
